## HUNTINGTON LAKE LOGGERS JAMBOREE EVENT RULES 2023

\* All contestants must fill out a Release of Liability waiver form before events start.

\* All contestants must report to event arena when the mandatory safety meeting is called.

\* The Event Coordinator reserves the right to refuse any contestant from competing at any time.

\* All contestants must be clean and sober.

\* Timing will be done by multiple stop-watch averages. Ties will be settled in a runoff.

\* Event decisions/disqualifications are up to the designated Judge's discretion.

\* All contestants must wear chaps, hearing, and eye protection during the chainsaw events.

\* All contestants must supply their own equipment.

\* There must be at least 3 contestants in each event to hold the event.

\* All contestants must be ready to participate for their event within 3 minutes.

\* In case of disqualification for any reason, entry money will not be refunded.

\* Only one person to use a chainsaw per class/event, no sharing saws!

\* Highest overall accumulation of points will be deemed overall Champion during events:

Points are as follows; 1\* place is 3pts, 2\* place is 2pts, and 3\* place is 1pt.

All Prize Money is split as follows; 3rd gets 20%, 2nd gets 30%, 1st 50%.

\* Log sizes may vary the day of the event. We will strive for the following sizes:

Handsaws > 14" \* > \*Hotsaw Class > 32

1. Women's Axe Throw: Rules are the same as Mens Axe Throw but for Women only.

2. Men's DBL Buck: Old style peg and raker saws only, No modified saws. Partners must be two men. There will be a depth set for everyone with the starting cut so it's all equal. Time starts when the first chips come out and stop with the cookie hits the ground.

3. Women's Stock: Saw will be provided by the event coordinator.

4. Choker Set: Contestants will run the course designed by the Judges. Contestants start on top of the log, time starts at Go, go over each log,grab choker, hurdle logs back to start and set choker around last log. Choker must be set properly if not it will result in a no time. Time Stops when choker is set and touch log behind setting log.

5. Obstacle Pole: The "obstacle pole/aerial bucking The pole rests on another log causing the end to be 5 feet off the ground. Starting with one hand on the starting point designated by the show, the contestant's hand must not leave the starting point or touch the saw before the command "Go". On "Go", the contestant picks up the saw, mounts the pole below the bottom 4' mark on the pole, races up the log and starts the saw after crossing the top 5° mark then severs a disc at the end of the pole. Upon severing the disc, shut off the saw before re-crossing the top 5' mark, race down the pole, one foot must be below the bottom 4' mark on the bottom of the log before touching the ground. Time stops. No saw cc/ci restrictions.

6. Steeple Chase: Standing upon the starting log with saw and provided gas can, contestant runs, hurdles log, places can on ground, starts saw, severs pole at designated width of 2 inches, kills saw, hurdles next log and repeats for total of 3 poles. Then runs back around ends of logs touching end of starting log to finish. Saw is off when not cutting and gas remains with contestant at all times.

7. Block & Chop: Standing 11"Log Time starts at first strike of axe and time stop when log is severed.

Log Rolling: Two contestants stand on log and walk,run,start,stop until one falls in. Best out of three wins.
Hotsaw: Must have started life as a chainsaw. Expansion Chambers and two-piece heads are okay. If saw does not start within 3 minutes, it will be up to the show if you can be moved to the end of the order or not. Time starts when chips fly and stops when cookie hits the ground. No time, will result in a cut out or not completing the cut.

10. Jack and Jill: Same as men's DBL Buck but with a female and a male partner.

11. Speed axe: Same as other axe throw events just that contestants have 60 seconds to score as many points and possible. There will be one scorer calling out scores, one-person timing and one person writing scores down. Contestant must be behind the line when throwing on all throws.

12. Unlimited Hotsaw: Same rules apply as other hot saw classes with only two exceptions: that the saw must be a single cylinder and the contestant must be able to carry the saw to the log and run it under their own power. If saw does not start within 3 minutes, it will be up to the show if you can be moved to the end of the order or not. Time starts when chips fly and stops when cookie hits the ground. No time, will result in a cut out or not completing the cut.

13. Climb & Cut: Climb pole apprx. 35` tall,pull up saw (provided) with your own handline. Ring bell with saw lower saw to ground, climb down, time stops when you touch ground.

14. Mens Axe Throw: Axes must be double bit, handle length must not be shorter than 24", leading edge no bigger than 6" and must be at least 2 1/2 lbs. Leading edge is the scoring edge, a dbl stick will not count. Starting line is at 20", if you cross the line when throwing it will not count, bulls eye will be 5' from the ground. Contestant scoring will be best 3 out of 4 throws. If axe breaks one of the scoring rings contestants get higher score. 4" ring scores as follows; bulls eye must break can (except speed axe) for 5pts, next ring 4pts, next 3pts, next 2pts, and most outer ring 1pt.

All event rules are made by the Pine Ridge Boosters Committee and may be subject to change by the event judges/referees at any time due to unforeseen circumstances. For "guidance" we reference American Lumberjack Association (ALA) Rules. http://www.americanlumberjacks.com
